## *Pastor's Column*

### **Storms**

With the recent storms that have swept across Missouri, many have questions. They vary widely from; "Where is God," to "How can a loving God let this happen?" There is much in life that is not understood. I am not trying to appear to have all of the answers, and do not believe anyone does, except God. Still I will throw a couple of things in the pool of thought for consideration. First, we must understand that the world is really an area of Spiritual Warfare. If you don't believe this read the first chapter in the book of Job. This world is under judgment (Matthew 24:7-8). Many if not most days are pleasant and enjoyable, but we are not to become complacent. There is a battle going on. The storms of life remind us of this fact and of our need to "draw nearer to God," through Jesus. Storms come in many forms, tornadoes, earthquakes, floods, wars, but also accidents, sickness, death and persecution. These storms can serve as a reminder of our need to trust in God. Mark 4:35-40, indicates there is safety in Christ. God can be glorified through the storms that invade our lives. Even in what appears to be a storm in our life, God works to accomplish His sovereign will. This is true even when we don't understand His actions.

The recent storms in Missouri and even those across the world remind us that life is fragile. Many have given of themselves, to help those who are in need. The UMC was at Joplin before the storm and will be there after the storms. Likewise God has not abandoned us, yet is calling us to rise up and be The Church. We are called upon to be caring Christians, in whom God can be seen. So the real question isn't "where is God during the storm." ## Missouri Disasters

The United Methodist Church has been reaching out to people in need, since it began. John Wesley was often criticized for taking manpower and money out of the church to help those with no connection to any church. He was a promoter of education and encouraged the construction of schools, universities and hospitals. Wesley also encouraged all to get involved in helping others. Today the UMC continues this legacy. Missouri Annual Conference has a very active Creative Ministries office, which also serves as the hub for Volunteers in Mission. VIM teams travel the world, reaching out in the name of Jesus. In the U.S. (as well as many countries) because the UMC is already established, it is often easy to get in and begin work. Additionally, we have people specifically trained in disaster relief. One is Christine Stockwell. While scores of UMC people were in Joplin on the ground and running. Christine has been on-site in Joplin as of Tuesday noon, May 24<sup>th</sup>. She has been registered with FEMA and MOMA. Her latest history includes working at New Orleans with Katrina survivors. Christine is a former trauma care nurse with EMS credentials, safe sanctuary trained which enables her to be good to go. The UMC is also in the Sedalia area, working through the UMC there. Missouri Conference disaster response coordinators are coordinating with the State Emergency Management Agency. The Missouri Conference equipment is being prepared to deploy. Personnel from UMPACT (the Conference property insurance provider) are standing by prepared to assess damages when they receive permission to enter the area.

Every United Methodist needs to know this single fact. When there is a disaster, in nearly any part of the world, the UMC is there. We don't seek the press, or try to get news out of our presence; we're just there serving others, in the name of Jesus The Christ. Anyone wishing to serve through VIM must complete the on-line safe sanctuary training, and have a willing heart. ## JOPLIN DISASTER

Monetary donations are being taken for the Joplin Tornado Disaster in our church. The Missouri Conference has established a fund to receive monies into the Disaster Response account to help with this disaster. Donations received here will be primarily used to help individuals effected but may also be used to help lift up the churches that have been destroyed. This money will be going towards keeping the Methodist Churches up and going to serve the community, long-term building efforts for Joplin, and getting the families in Joplin started again. Checks are to be made payable to the Macon UMC and is to be placed in the offering plate. Be sure to put in the memo of your check "Joplin Disaster". Money can also be dropped off to the church office. Please keep those affected by this tornado in your prayers.

## **Join the Flock at Bethlehem Village!**

VBS will be held here at Macon UMC July 25<sup>th</sup> - July 29<sup>th</sup>, from 6:00 - 8:30 p.m. Planning is underway and Rhonda asks each of you to be praying about where God can use your special talents and gifts to reach those for Jesus Christ. Bethlehem Village will be very much like last year's VBS. During Bethlehem Village, kids and adults will explore the culture of Bethlehem at the time of Jesus' birth. We will all be in costume again and living the week in a Holy Land Adventure.

We will need a Census Taker, who will be a cultural guide, helping families understand what it was like for Jews to live in the Roman Empire. We will need a Drama Team Leader to direct a group of actors who will bring God's Word to life through "spontaneous" dramas that draw kids and adults into real Bible events. Each day your team will help families discover what it was like to be in the city of Bethlehem, to live before God sent Jesus, and even to celebrate Jesus' amazing birth.

Shopkeepers and other "citizens" will talk with families about what's happening in Bethlehem. They'll refer to the daily drama as a real event that took place in the center of the town. We will have numerous shops set up in the marketplace...just as we did last year. Some of those shops could be a Dye Shop, Mosaic Shop, Toy-Making Shop, Stained Glass Shop, Bakery, Coin-Making Shop, Farmer's Market. Let your gifts and talents play a role in what we might be able to come up with. Please come in and visit with Rhonda, as she is preparing to lay this out and help her to know what she has to work with.

We will need a Gathering Leader who will lead the children and adults in 10-15 minutes of worship and announcements, teach the Bethlehem Village songs and motions, and introduce each day's Bible Point. They will also lead the closing each evening for about 15 minutes as we sing and worship before dismissal.

We will need numerous Tribe Leaders, who are the heart and soul of Bethlehem Village. The time children and adults spend with their tribal families will be the most memorable, life-changing, and thought-provoking time of the entire program! Without your guidance and leadership, Bethlehem Village would simply be an interesting experience. When you lead families through meaningful discussions and discoveries, Bethlehem Village becomes a faith-building event.
